It's the perfect place to pick up a piece of gorgeous Irish craft and the shop offers worldwide shipping of all items.

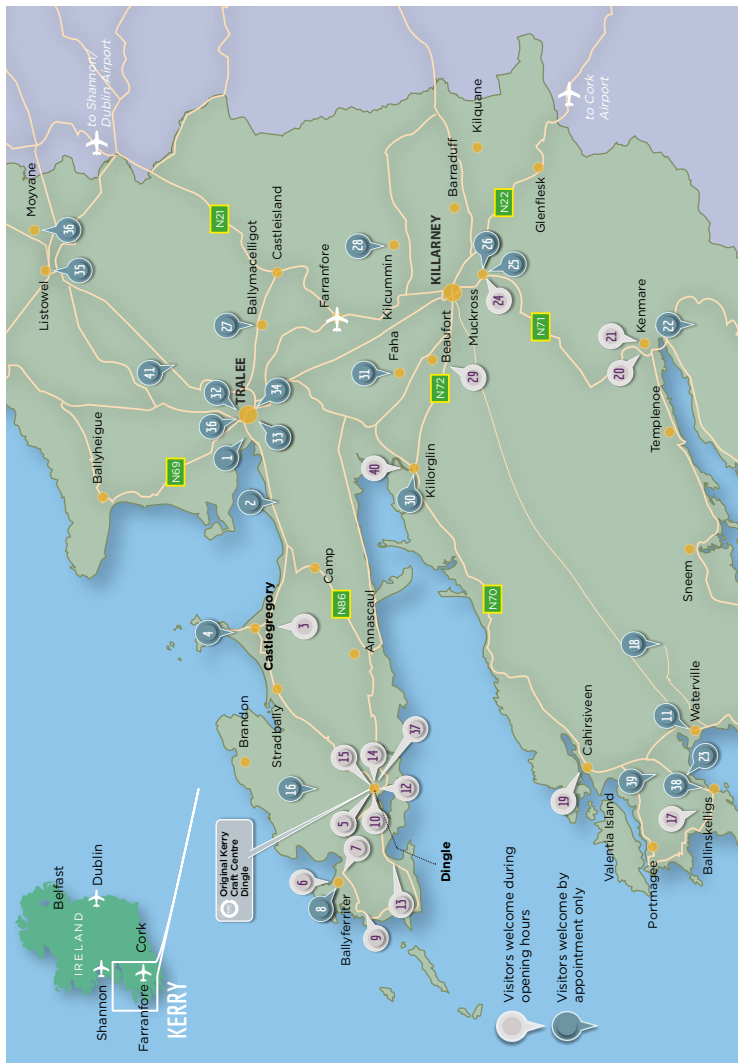

Meeet professional designers and craft makers when you visit the Kerry Craft Trail. Studio locations are dotted across the County of Kerry. A visit to any studio along the route offers you the chance to see first-hand the making of exceptional craft work. Demonstrations and workshops with the makers can be arranged and the studios and workshop spaces are ideally suited to small touring

bus groups (max. 20) and private cars. Look for the Kerry Craft Trail sign on approved craft makers' premises.

Many makers have a studio, shop, toilets and café facilities on-site. Making contact in advance with each stop you wish to visit is recommended, especially outside of the Summer season. Private craft demonstrations and workshops can be arranged by contacting the maker directly. It is free to visit any of the stops along the Trail but there is generally a charge for workshops and detailed demonstrations. Makers' fees and charges are at their own discretion. Opening times can vary; please contact makers in advance.

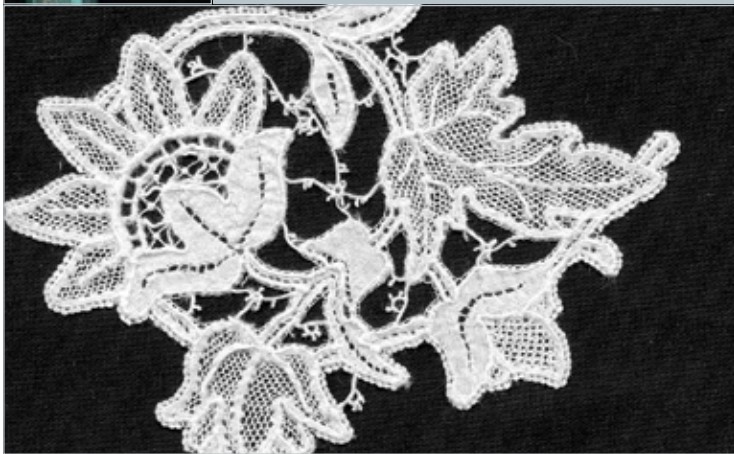
